





Something happens in parts of Europe at the turn of 15th century




This changed everything in Western Europe and later globally!

It was the beginning of the Modern Civilization




The Modern Civilization attempts to present itself in a certain manner ...

- Therefore we are the pinnacle of the human civilization






Age of Piracy & Terror on the Seas



Thousands of pirates were active between 1650 and 1720, and these years are sometimes known as the 'Golden Age' of piracy. Famous pirates from this period include Henry Morgan, William 'Captain' Kidd, 'Calico' Jack Rackham, Bartholomew Roberts and the fearsome Blackbeard (Edward Teach).



And colonialization is rarely mentioned...



Britain drained a total of nearly \$45 trillion from India during the period 1765 to 1938. It's a staggering sum. For perspective, \$45 trillion is 17 times more than the total annual gross domestic product of the United Kingdom today.

WORLDVIEW – Fundamental realities – what is real and what is not?


VALUES – What is good and what is bad?

Worldview – modern world is based on a specific worldview




Values & anti-values: The modern world has an elaborate value system.

Natural Sciences


More attention towards them and marginalizing of even social sciences

Adam Smith and free market economy - Laissezfaire capitalism








Robert Bulwer-Lytton – 1876 Colonial India









320 thousand tons of grains exported to Europe in years 1877 and 1878






THESE ARE SOFT LAYERS OF A CIVILIZATION

Big tech companies


Movies, Serials, Games
